Equestrian Section

Conditions and Regulations for the Equestrian Section. To be read in conjunction with the general conditions of Southland A & P Association printed previous and the rules and regulations as set out by The Royal Agricultural Society.

1. All horses or ponies competing either in competitive classes or ring events must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner or a member of his or her family and all animals must be named at time of entry.
2. All leased horses or ponies competing at this Show must be registered with the Royal Agricultural Society. Such lease must be for a term of not less than twelve months and must be registered before entries are made.
3. No entire or filly under the age of two years shall be eligible for Senior Championships except in the Clydesdale, Welsh, Arab, Thoroughbred, Hackney and Sport Horse sections. Although it is provided that horses may compete in more than one class any or all of such classes may be judged simultaneously at the convenience of the judges or stewards. In all such cases exhibitors having an exhibit entered in more than one class must elect in which class they compete.
4. All horses and ponies in classes of prescribed height must be measured shoes or no shoes and the person in charge must produce a current RAS Height Certificate.
5. Stallions are permitted in all classes they are eligible for but must be led, be in the appropriate harness prescribed by the Breed Society the stallion is registered with, or which is prescribed by the host Show, or if ridden must be in appropriate bridle and be in total

control. A Steward will order any stallion considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion owner/exhibitor/competitor. It is compulsory for all stallions, regardless of age, to wear identification badge "S" at all shows at all times. These badges will be available from the Association Secretary at a cost of \$2 a pair. 6. Before any prizes are awarded in entire classes, horses may be liable to examination by the Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society. The decision of the Veterinary Surgeon shall be absolutely final and binding on all parties and shall not be questioned by any court. The entry by an exhibitor in any class affected will be deemed an acceptance clause. 7. Ages of all horses shall be computed as at 1st August. 8. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society (Inc) Forbidden Substances Judiciary Committee (FSJC) procedures and rules (refer page 7-10 Royal Agricultural Society by-laws and Regulations). 9. Any competitor who has administered to their horse or ponies any drug during the 7 days prior to the Show is required to notify the Horse Secretary of the Show before competing. 10. The above requirements must be completed in writing and the Horse Secretary should provide facility as for scratchings and substitutions. 11. This Show supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system which will operate in the Equestrian Section of all RAS affiliated Shows and will be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution. Implementation of the "Yellow Card" will be in accordance of the RAS Rules that accompanied this Card, and full wording of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website. **YARDING/STABLING** Yards available on the grounds at Donovan Park at a charge of \$10.00 per night or \$10 for the weekend. Invercargill Top10 Holiday Park has grazing available free of charge for those people who stay with them. **BACK NUMBERS** Back Numbers will be issued from the Horse Secretary's office on Show days. Exhibitors must wear back numbers at all times while in the ring. A \$10.00 surcharge will apply on back numbers not returned to the office at the end of the show. Should the height of any horse or pony be questioned, it shall be decided by the Veterinary Surgeons and Royal Agricultural Society Official Measuring Steward. All horses entered in breeding classes must be named. **MEASURING** Please note there will be NO measuring at the show. **ENTRY FORMS** By signing the entry form, exhibitors accept that they are aware that it is their responsibility to ensure that they read and accept the regulations and information as printed in this schedule. A receipt showing all details of your entries will be returned to you following data processing. **ENTRY FEES** Members \$6.00, non-members \$8.00. A \$1.00 RAS levy is payable for each entry in the Horse Section this is shown individually on your entry form. All RAS levies paid will be forwarded directly to the RAS. To encourage participation, exhibitors residing North of the Waitaki River are entitled to a 50% discount on entry fees; Entry fee discount does not include stable/pen fees, ground fees, catalogues etc. **FIRST AID AND SAFETY** A \$5.00 first aid and safety fee has been automatically added to all entry forms and is payable per exhibitor. This fee will ensure that you as an exhibitor has on-site access and care during the Show by a quality Paramedic. **PRIZE MONEY** Prize money is relative to the cost of the entry fees and the number of entries received and calculated as follows: 1-3 entries \$12.00 & \$8.00 4 plus entries \$16.00, \$12.00 & \$8.00 Show Jumping and RTR Competitions refer to individual classes for entry fees and prize money. **LATE ENTRIES** will only be accepted on a discretionary basis by the Horse Marshal or their appointed

To provide a transition from the Lead Rein section to the open ridden section, where a rider does not have to canter on the circle in company. A Combination is only able to compete in this section for a maximum of twenty-four (24) months. First Ridden Ponies not to exceed 138cm. First Ridden Ponies must be ridden in a snaffle bridle with a cavesson noseband, a snaffle bit and a single rein-refer to Appendix B. A First Ridden Pony may compete in the Open ring with a different rider. No spurs to be worn. TUBERCULOSIS REGULATIONS Two documents are required: a) The Herd Status Declaration card - All cattle entered for showing which are three months of age and over must be accompanied in transit by the usual signed and dated TB Declaration Card showing either TB free or C3 Herd status or better in accordance with present law. b) Transit cards - These cards must be produced before cattle trucks are allowed onto the showgrounds to unload stock. Failure to present the card will result in stock not being allowed on the showgrounds. **TB MOVEMENT CONTROLLED AREAS** Cattle 90 days of age and over which are farmed or grazed within a declared TB movement control area, must be negative to a TB test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. C10 status herds in Surveillance Areas: A clearly dated test allocation or other documentation from the AHB must be submitted that shows the herd is not overdue for a whole herd test. C3 status or better: Cattle over 12 months of age farmed or grazed outside of a declared TB movement controlled area must be negative to a TB test within 12 months prior to being moved to the Show OR MUST have a clear test within the current show season. C1 or C2 status: Cattle over 12 months of age farmed or grazed outside of the declared TB movement controlled area must be negative to a TB test within the current show season. A clear TB test certificate showing individual animal identification numbers must accompany completed entry forms when returned to the Secretary. All exhibitors must

sign the TB declaration on the official entry form. OTHER CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS All Pedigree cattle one year old and over must be entered in a recognised Herd Book. Proof of dual-ownership is required. All Cattle must be haltered and capable of being led. All bulls born before last December must be nose rung, led by the ring and under adequate supervision. All bulls must be securely tied in the stalls by an adequate halter as well as a leather collar or chain. Failure to observe the above can mean disqualification from parading. The date of birth of all cattle must be stated at time of entry. Age of cattle shall be computed as at 1st June (calves inclusive). All purebred cattle shall be led into the Show Ring when required by Stewards or Judges. Animals entered in Special Classes must also be entered in at least one other breed class for which they are eligible. In all classes of female stock, judges to withhold awards for cattle which in their opinion are barren. Exhibitors please note that there will be NO green feed supplies. The Dairy Cattle Section of the Southland A & P Association acknowledges GLOBAL MILKING SYSTEMS for the supply of milking machines during the show.

CHAMPIONSHIPS With the exception of the All-Breeds Dairy Cattle both Beef and Dairy Cattle will observe the following procedures in selection of Championships. Senior champions (Male & Female) and Junior Champions (Male & female) will be selected as in By-Law 41. Refer General By-laws at front of schedule.

PRODUCTION QUALIFICATIONS All cows three years of age and over entered into type and production classes in milk must have been tested and have production records above the recognised standards for the various systems of testing. Records to be supplied at time of entry. The age of stock in this section must date from 1st June in each year.

SYSTEM OF TESTING AND PRODUCTION STANDARDS Group Herd Test records will be accepted. The standards of production required under these systems are as follows: Age at starting 305 Day Test Protein test 2 year olds 140kg butterfat 110kg 3 year olds 160kg 125kg 4 year olds 180kg 140kg Mature 200kg 155kg Type - 100 points maximum for first cow 2 years 1 point for every 3.0kg above the standard 3 years 1 point for every 3.5kg above the standard 4 years 1 point for every 4.0kg above the standard Any exhibitor not complying with the above conditions will be disqualified. Yearling Bulls and Heifers cannot be entered in both Senior & Junior Classes. Animals born prior to October must be entered in the Senior Class. The pedigree and name of the breeder must be supplied at the time of entry. Production records for cows, which have not completed their lactation at the time of closure of entries, are to be handed in to the Chief Steward on the day of the Show. Attention of exhibitors is brought to the following clause 15 of the General Bylaws: Any case of misconduct or practices offensive to the public or any form of ill treatment to livestock will be reported to the Marshal of the section who will take the necessary action.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES Any animal may be tested for drugs or forbidden substances at any show under the by-laws and regulations adopted by the Royal Agricultural Society and the procedures adopted by the FSJC. The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in showing. i) Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally with an irritant or counter-irritant, or other substances to artificially improve the conformation. ii) Surgery or insertion or foreign matter under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animals body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management. iii) Criticising or interfering with the Judge, Show Management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the breed or the show. iv) Setting teats or manipulation of a teat to alter its normal position such as to unnaturally hold it plumb or to alter its length.
