Please read the Regulations carefully. To avoid any misunderstandings and inconvenience to themselves, exhibitors are particularly requested to make themselves conversant with the conditions governing these Sections. The Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident. The lodgement of a completed entry form will be taken as a guarantee that the animals specified therein are free from all disease as far as is known by the owner. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property at the show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. The Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the ground or premises, nor will the Society, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or mis-delivery of any exhibits. Any exhibitor who does not comply with the above rules or any directions of the Chief Steward may be penalised or disqualified. Any dispute that may arise shall be decided by not less than three (3) members of the beef cattle sub-committee and their decision shall be final.

REGULATIONS APPLYING TO BEEF CATTLE SECTION ENTRY All cattle entered must carry an NLIS device. All cattle entered in stud cattle classes must be registered in the name of the exhibitor as owner in a properly constituted herd book of the relevant breed association and must comply with the rules and regulations of the relevant breed association. All exhibitors to provide hard copy proof of \$5million Public Liability cover with entry form. In all cases where age is a condition of entry, the understanding is that the exhibitor will, if called upon, sign a statutory declaration to the age of the animal entered. e. For all classes in which the age of the exhibit is a condition of the competition, the entry form will state the actual date of birth, which will be attained at the 1 April 2016 and the exhibit shall be entered in the classes accordingly. Calves shown with Dams are ineligible to compete in individual calf classes (excepting Junior Heifer Show). Any breed exhibiting 30 or more head will be eligible to be judged as their own breed section. The Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. reserves the right to combine classes in the event of there being insufficient numbers to judge as a single class. A maximum of two adjoining classes maybe combined. In the event of entry numbers being in excess of cattle accommodation, a restriction on the number of animals which may be exhibited in any one class by an exhibitor may be imposed, in which case a full refund of entry fees and levies will be made. Exhibitors are requested to pay particular attention to the completion of entry forms which should be completed in all detail, as it is from this document that the catalogue will be compiled. The only person authorised to inject animals while they are at the showgrounds, is the honorary veterinarian, who shall advise the stewards if in their opinion such drug or tranquiliser is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize. 4. ARRIVAL Exhibits must be on the grounds by 5.00pm Tuesday, 13 June 2017 Caravans/Trailer/Trucks are to be in place by 5.00pm Tuesday, 13 June 2017

5. EXHIBITOR WRISTBANDS Exhibitors and livestock attendants: passes will be issued on the basis of two (2) passes for the first to four head exhibited and one (1) pass every four head thereafter. c. Additional passes may be purchased at a cost of \$5.00. d. Exhibitor passes must be worn at all times.

6. ADMISSION OF VEHICLES Vehicles must have their Parking Permits displayed at all times. No Parking Permit, No entry.

7. STOCK Exhibits must be weighed by

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9.30am Wednesday, 14 June 2017 All bulls over the age of 12 months must be ringed, all females over 12 months and led steers must be ringed or dogged when handled on the grounds. Handlers must use nose leads at all times when handling these animals it shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that animals in the stud and led steer section which are brought onto the grounds are tractable and able to be restrained and handled without causing damage. Any Animal which behaves in an unsatisfactory manner may be expelled from the stud cattle area by order of the Chief Steward. All cattle are to be restrained properly at night with a halter and neck collar or chain.

8. **BEDDING & FODDER** Sawdust bedding will be provided by the Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. for use. The use of straw is not permitted due to fire regulations. The provision of fodder is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

9. **WASHING** Washing of cattle on the grounds is permitted only in the designated wash bay areas and only using shampoo brands which are Phosphorus free. Failure to comply with this regulation will render Exhibitors liable to substantial fines under Department of Environment legislation and the animal ineligible to compete.

10. **STOCK MOVEMENT** All stock must be accompanied by a fully completed Animal Health Declaration Only tick free stock will be allowed entry on to the grounds. Exhibitors returning to tick free country need to make their own clearance arrangements.

11. **NLIS** All animals must have an NLIS device fitted prior to leaving the property of origin (this includes calves). All Waybills or Animal Health Declaration are to be made available to the Chief Steward for processing of NLIS data. As a precaution it is advisable to have replacement tags available in the event of a missing or faulty tag. A replacement tag supplied by Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. may incur a fee. **THE SHOWGROUNDS PIC NUMBER: QGRH0079**

12. **DEPARTURE** Cattle entered for competition must be on display for the duration of the Show and are NOT permitted to leave the grounds prior to 3.00pm Friday, 16 June 2017.

13. **DOGS** All dogs are to be leashed or otherwise restrained from roaming the Grounds. Failure to adhere to this rule can lead to dogs being collected by a Local Laws Officer.

14. **AGE & DATE OF BIRTH FOR ALL BREEDS** The following tables shows the birth date on or between which animals must have been born in order to be eligible for each age class Age as calculated at 1 June 2017.

15. **JUDGING** The entries will be arranged and paraded in order from youngest to oldest in each class. For championship prizes (senior championship, junior championship, calf champion), all 1st prize winners of the sex and breed to compete. After selecting the champion, the judge will be required to select an animal which will take the place of the champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause. The reserve shall be selected from the remaining 1st prize animals, together with 2nd prize of the class which furnished the champion. A Supreme Champion Bull and Female shall be awarded with the Grand Champion or Champion of each breed as the case may be to compete. A Supreme Champion Breeders Group shall be awarded with the winning breeders group from each breed to compete. The order of presentation of ribbons will be 1st - Blue, 2nd - Red, 3rd - White, 4th - Yellow, 5th - Light Green.

16. **GROUPS** Breeder's Groups (All Breeds except Brahmans) - To consist of either 2 males and 1 female, or 1 male and 2 females, to have been exhibited in their respective classes and bred by the exhibitor. Brahman Breeder's Group - To consist of a pair of males and a pair of females, not necessarily owned but bred by the Exhibitor. Sire' Progeny Groups - To consist of either 2 males and 1 female or 1 male and 2 females, owned by the exhibitor, all the progeny of the one sire. (The sire's name to be listed). The animals to have been exhibited in their respective classes. Dam's Progeny Group - To consist of 2 progeny from the one dam and must have competed in previous classes. (The dam's name to be listed).

ensure the correct information is held by the Rockhampton Agricultural Show Society Inc. The name of horses
must be stated at the time of entry with all particulars requested. Incorrectly filled in class tickets will not be
accepted. No transfers will be considered under any circumstances except by measurement or Judge's
classification, with the exception of Show Jumping entries where horses may be substituted. Competitors
nominated in two rings where times clash must make a choice of which event they are to compete in and, with the
exception of championships, events will not be held up for late riders under any circumstances. Mounts entered in
classes for girls cannot compete in classes for boys or vice versa. Any competitor breaking this regulation may
disqualify themselves from all further events. Application for camping space must be made with show entries with
the \$30.00 fee. Camping is available in Victoria Park. Caravans/Trailers must be placed by 4.00pm on Tuesday,
13 June 2017. A charge of \$30.00 per stall is payable with the Stable Booking Form and must be received by the
Society Administration Office not later than 02 June 2017. Owing to the limited number of horse stalls, stalls will be
allocated in order of receipt of entries/bookings. STALLS TO BE USED FOR THE STABLING OF HORSES ONLY,
and could possibly be allotted for day of competition only. The Committee cannot be responsible for the stabling of
all horses. EXHIBITORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO USE ANY OTHER STABLE OTHER THAN THOSE
ALLOCATED TO THEM. In the event of any person placing horses in boxes or stalls without authority, the horses
will be removed, at once, from the Showgrounds by order of the Ring Committee at the owners risk and expense.
The allocation of stalls and the movement of horses and gear to and from such stalls shall be under the control of
the Horse Superintendent. Exhibitors not carrying out the instructions of the Horse Superintendent may, if so
desired by the Ring Committee, be barred from competing and the animals concerned must be removed from the
Showgrounds. No stallion may be entered in hack or riding classes, except where specifically stated in the
schedule. Age of all horses to be computed as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year
shall be deemed to be one year old on that date. All horses entered for competition in stud classes must be
registered in a stud book of their respective breed society recognized by the Royal National Association.
Registrations papers (or copies) must be produced upon request. Where breed regulations require, nominations
must be accompanied by breeding details. In any class for which a prescribed age is a condition, the only horses

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that can be entered or compete are those the age of which, calculated by clause 18, is in accordance with the conditions. No horses under or over the prescribed age can compete. Competitors must report to the Steward in charge of the respective judging ring to have the class ticket collected, otherwise the animal and/or competitor will not be allowed to compete. Horses entered in any class for which a prescribed height is a condition, MUST be able to produce a Height Certificate if requested by the Chief Steward or Management Committee. Each exhibitor must state on their class ticket the number of class in which they intend to compete, and full particulars of the horses entered in each class. In the event of there being no competition in a class the merit of the exhibit shall be the sole guide in awarding or withholding any prize, also if the merit of the exhibits in any class or championship is not, in the opinion of the judge, sufficient to entitle them to a prize, the judge may withhold any or all prizes. The Committee reserves the right to substitute a judge where deemed necessary and without notice. Foals accompanying their dams must be haltered and kept under control. Horses shall be paraded on the days and at the time indicated in the official program. All the exhibitors and attendants must obey the instructions of the Horse Section Superintendent while they or their exhibits are within the precincts of the horse pavilion and adjacent yards. If any person fails to carry out the instructions of the Horse Superintendent then birth certificate of each competitor in classes where age is stipulated, MUST be produced if required. Any animal which, in the opinion of the Committee Stewards is not in a fit state to be exhibited, may be rejected by them, and debarred from competing in the class or classes for which it is entered. Any animal rejected must be removed from the Showgrounds as soon as the exhibitor is notified. The use of hormones and/or tranquillisers is prohibited. Any exhibitors violating this regulation will be dealt with by the Committee. Horse floats will be permitted to load or unload horses at a special pick up point on the corner of Lion Creek Road and Exhibition Road. The time limit for the use of this area will be thirty (30) minutes. Any vehicles in this area longer than 30 minutes will be removed at the owner's expense. Any exhibitor or competitor who competes in an event in which a person or animal has not been correctly nominated, will be liable to a fine or disqualification at the discretion of the Chief Steward, Horse Committee Representative and Chief Executive Officer. The owner of such animal will be considered equally guilty with the rider of the animal. Any person breaking any of the rules, by-laws or regulations of the Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. will be liable to a fine or disqualification from any further competition, as may be decided by the relevant disputes sub-committee. Horses not to be in the competitive area of the grounds before 8.00am Wednesday, 14 June and must vacate the camping area by Sunday, 18 June 2017. Sex of animal must be clearly stated when applying for stabling. The Society accepts no responsibility for exhibits and will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused by an exhibit. It shall be the condition of entry that any exhibitor will hold the Committee blameless and indemnified against any legal action arising from such accident. All galloways must be over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands. Ponies over 12.2 hands may be ridden by adults over 17 years of age. All attendants must be suitably attired. It is a request that all stallions and mares in led-in classes must be kept under control at all times with either bits or chains. A Maiden is determined to be someone who has never won a blue ribbon at any Agricultural Society Show at the close of nominations. A Novice is determined to be someone who has never won an Open Champion at any Agricultural Society Show at the close of nominations. An Intermediate is determined to be someone who has never won a blue ribbon at a Royal Agricultural Show or Horse of the Year Show at the close of nominations. Consolation classes will be Post Entry with nil nomination fee. ALL DOGS ARE TO BE LEASHED OR OTHERWISE EFFECTIVELY RESTRAINED FROM ROAMING ON THE GROUNDS. NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS 1.1 Birds can only be removed from showing area with the permission of the Chief Steward. 1.2 Any Bird entered in the incorrect class can, at the discretion of the Chief Steward, be re-entered in the correct class. 1.3 No birds to be removed or handled without the Steward's permission. 1.4 Any Bird found to have been tampered with may, at the discretion of the Stewards and Committee, be disqualified 1.5 Eggs remain the property of the affiliated Agricultural Society. 1.6 No trimming, plucking or dyeing of feathers, staining of legs or any fraudulent practice will be allowed. 1.7 Every Exhibitor will be deemed responsible for the condition in which his/her exhibit appears in the pen. Fees - \$2.50 per class Bedding fee - \$4.00 per pen, per day All entries and fees must be submitted to the
Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. office, by the closing date. Friday, 9 June 2017.
Exhibitors may be asked to reduce entry numbers, if number exceed pen capacity. All stock to be on the grounds
by 8am and may be removed at the conclusion of judging. Judging will commence at 9am on Friday, 16 June 2017
All goats must be registered in a herd book or registration applied for. (Proof of application may be requested.)
CAPRINE RETRO VIRUS: Exhibits must be from a herd which has complied with the requirements of a Caprine
Retro Virus control scheme approved by the DPI. Proof of certificate must accompany entries. Department of
Agriculture, Fisheries & Forestry Qld requires owners to have a permit to travel stock. DAIRY GOAT
SOCIETY OF AUSTRALIA QLD BRANCH RULES To attract Australian Champion points, the show is to be
conducted in accordance with Regulation 69 of the rules of the DGSA. Agricultural Show Societies have the right
to accept or reject entries held on their grounds and need not give reason for doing so. Clubs must abide by this
ruling. All goats must be clearly tattooed. Age is to be calculated to the day of showing. Goats entered in
progeny, type and production, best udder or other speciality classes must be entered in the appropriate age class.
All does shown in milking classes must be milked out by the end of the best udder class. The judge may or may

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not award places and championships as he/she chooses. The Chief Steward has control over the running of the show on the day of showing. Dairy Doe points will be awarded for shows with a Branch

144th Rockhampton Agricultural Show 14 -16 June 2017 UTE MUSTER Held under the by-laws and regulations of the Rockhampton Agricultural & Citizens Show Society Inc. which are deemed to be included herein at full length. Please read the Regulations carefully. To avoid any misunderstandings and inconvenience to themselves, exhibitors are particularly requested to make themselves conversant with the conditions governing these Sections.

REGULATIONS APPLYING TO UTE MUSTER SECTION RULES & INFORMATION APPLYING TO

ROCKHAMPTON AGRICULTURAL SHOW: Vehicles are required to be on display for the duration of the Show. Vehicles must be on the grounds and in place by 8.00am Wednesday, 14 June. Vehicles cannot be removed from the grounds until 9.30pm Friday, 16 June. **PRIZES:** Classes - 1st \$100.00, 2nd \$50.00, 3rd \$25.00 People's Choice Award - \$ THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY TO: Local, Sub-Chamber and State Finals. It is important that the "characters" of the Ute's drivers and owners are readily accepted, as the overall event is to recognise the true "identity" of the Aussie Ute. It is accepted that some Show Societies already host "Ute" competitions. These Societies can maintain their traditional competition. Should these Societies wish to participate in the QCAS State Ute Muster they MUST include the QCAS Classes in their competition. Show Societies wishing to introduce the QCAS State Ute Muster Series to their Show Program are required to abide by these Rules and Regulations.

RIGHT OF ENTRY Competitors are permitted to enter the competition at any number of Shows. Only registered vehicles are eligible to enter the competition. If a competitor wins a class at one Show, they may still compete at other Shows. The Class Winner can only represent ONE CLASS AND ONE SHOW at Sub-Chamber Level and that Show is the one at which they first won, irrespective of the number of Shows entered. The Sub-Chamber Winners can only represent ONE CLASS AND ONE SUB-CHAMBER with the one vehicle at State Level. In the event that the Winner of a Class is ineligible to compete under rules 4 & 5 above, the Runner Up or other eligible vehicle will be permitted to compete at Sub-Chamber and State Final Titles in place of the Winner. Please Note: It is the responsibility of the vehicle owner to notify the Show Society or Sub-Chamber Coordinator of their ineligibility to compete at a higher level. **CONDUCT OF COMPETITORS - (Drivers/Owners):** 7. Steward's directives must be followed. 8. Queensland Road Rules apply to competitors both inside and outside of the venue. 9. Rules applying to the specific Venue/Showgrounds must be observed at all times. 10. Speed must be limited as per Showground signage or as directed. 11. Vehicles are to be parked as directed and not moved unless directed by Stewards / Officials. 12. Intoxicated owners or drivers will be disqualified from the competition. 13. Excessive noise levels will not be permitted. 14. Burnouts or donuts will not be tolerated. 15. Competitors may undergo a breathalyser test. Refusal will mean immediate disqualification. 16. Any Owner/Driver behaving in a manner considered to be inappropriate will be disqualified. 17. Any person not abiding by any of the above Rules will automatically be disqualified. **NOMINATIONS FOR ENTRY:** 18. Any REGISTERED vehicle that is classified as a UTE (tray back, well back, drop side or converted to a Ute) may be nominated by the owner and/or driver. 19. If converted to a Ute a Certificate of Inspection will be required. 20. The driver of the vehicle must have a current driver's licence. **NOMINATION FEES:** recommended for the event are as follows: 21. \$10.00 nomination fee per vehicle, for entry to each class Note: No nomination fee is required for Sub-Chamber or State Final; The official QCAS Nomination Form is to be completed and the Waiver signed to gain entry to the Event. **JUDGING:** 22. Vehicles will be judged according to the individual classes' criteria. 23. Owners or Drivers of vehicles must remain with their vehicle while judging of that particular class is in progress. 24. The WINNER of the overall championship at the STATE FINAL is not eligible to be judged for the SAME TITLE for a period of one (1) year if they have qualified again for the State Finals. 25. The Judges decision is final. 26. The following eight (8) classes have been selected to give the best overall cross-section of entries. 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UTE MUSTER

Class 5001 Street Ute

All makes and models. Tailored for street driving, with or without custom modifications. Immaculate presentation, precise detail dedicated to entire vehicle. Interior, exterior, under bonnet engine bay and tray presentation.

History of Ute, bought or custom.

Class 5002 B & S Ute

All makes and models. The typical B & S Ball Ute showing evidence of Ball attendance, with Badges, Stickers, Aerials, Mud flaps, Roll bar, Bulbar and Spotlights. Overall interior and exterior presentation. Aerial flags are encouraged for display, but judging will be based on the vehicle itself.

Class 5003 Chicks Ute

All makes and models MUST be registered solely in females' name. (Registration papers are to be supplied for viewing). Best interior and exterior with personal touches and accessories and overall Ute presentation. History of Ute, bought or custom. Additional decorations, flowers and stuffed toys are welcome for display, but judging will be based on the vehicle itself

Class 5004 4 x 4 Ute

All makes and models. Best representation of a 4X 4 Ute, in constant use or part time 4 wheel drive. Additional four wheel drive accessories added to vehicle and including overall interior and exterior presentation.

Class 5005 Work Ute

All makes and models. Displaying Toolboxes and Trade accessories, and (where applicable) MUST exhibit clear Business or Trade signage on the vehicle. Overall interior and exterior presentation

Class 5006 Feral Ute

All makes and models. The real character Ute. Seen a lot of life, Bulbar, Stickers, Additional accessories, Antennas, reasonably neglected, unkempt and complete with dents. Aerial flags are permitted for display purposes only but will not be considered for judging. Ute MUST be roadworthy

Class 5007 Classic Ute

Any restored Ute over 30 years of age. Must be roadworthy and registered With or without modifications to the engine and body but still being able to identify the "true" make and model.

Class 5008 Town & Country Ute

All makes and models. Immaculate presentation and with an overhead rollbar and lights, bulbar, UHF aerial, mud flaps, art work, side skirts, and very minimal stickers all add to points. Must have at least one (1) component which excludes the Ute from the 'Street Ute' or excelling in 'B & S Ute' Example - Polished and with music pumping pulled up outside the fanciest city hotel the driver steps out wearing a suite and brand new cowboy hat while his girlfriend is in the most elegant of evening gowns. Likewise the same Ute would look just as at home backed up to the fence at a rodeo.
