Section 1 Horses And Ponies

AREA CONVENER: Simon Lee *RAS Equestrian Rule Book: Our Show is run under RAS rules. All conveners' of Sections in Horse Area have copies of the Rule Book. As does the Horse Area Convener and The Administration Officer. A copy is also available on the RAS Web Site. Please familiarize yourself with the rules and abide by them.

* Annual or Life, Height Certificates - All competitors must carry Certificates. The Association will accept life or annual Certificates issued by the Royal Agricultural Society. Only an official Measuring certificate (Metcalf Device) will be accepted. *SJ Classes over 1m; Any class above 1m please provide ESNZ Horse Registration number and Membership number on entry form. Entries will not be accepted without these. *Age of Riders and Handlers - Riders/Handler's age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st August. Riders/Handlers who are of age for any division/section on the 1st August complete the show year/season in that division/section. RAS rule CDE 11. *Day Measure: Temporary Measuring Certificates can only be issued to competitors who live in the Cheviot District. This measuring to take place only on Show Day (RAS rule M/Appendix A). * Back Number/Number holders must be worn by all Horse and Pony competitors. One back number required for each Horse and Pony/Rider combination. Return back numbers to the Show Office. LAST HORSE RING RIDERS, HAND BACK NUMBERS to gate steward. * District Riders and Horses must have resided in the District for 3 months to be eligible to ride in District classes. * No Change of Rider will be allowed in any of the Horse or Pony classes after once entering the Ring for that class, except in exceptional cases, when the consent of the Judge or Steward must be obtained. * Rider for Championship: In all Horse and Pony events the rider for championship must be the same

rider who won in the class. *Holding up Classes: No class will be held up for a rider competing in another Ring. * Combined or deleted Classes: The Association reserves the right to combine or delete classes as it sees fit. * Refund of Entry Fees - A Qualified Veterinary, Farrier, Chiropractor or Medical Certificate must be produced within 7 days and will be accepted as sufficient to support a claim of 75% refund of entry fees. *Stallions: In all Horse and Pony classes NO STALLIONS may be entered. NOVICE CLASSES - CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: a) A Novice exhibit or rider is one that has yet to win 6 classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show/Event. b) Wins at all affiliated RAS Shows/Events including HOY must be recorded on the RAS Certificate and/or Performance card. c) Sections may be Show Pony, Saddle Hunter Pony, Cobs, Park Hacks, Hacks, Saddle Hunters, Riding Horses, Paced and Mannered Classes in each of the preceding divisions, Working Hunters (ponies/horses), Hunter Jumping Horse/Pony, and Rider Classes. d) Once an exhibit has achieved 6 wins in any RAS section, the exhibit is not eligible to return to 'Novice' status even if it changes sections. Refer to CDE 1 c) & d) e) Winners failing to produce their RAS certificates when requested by the Steward forfeit their awards on the day. f) An Open Pony may start in the Open classes within the First Ridden or Lead Rein sectors only (not in the Novice classes). g) Novice exhibits are eligible for Open classes. If that Novice exhibit wins the Open class then they are eligible for the Open Championship. h) All wins in Novice classes within each section (not breed sections) count and must be recorded on the RAS Certificate. Should a Novice exhibit win on conformation class including Ladies classes, these wins must also be recorded. i) The number of Novice wins is to be counted at the time of the Show/Event, not the time of entry. If a Novice entry exceeds the permitted number of wins by the day of the Show/Event the competitor must advise the Administration Office and change to an Open class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned after the Show/Event. j) Imported Horse/Pony - Any wins gained overseas by a horse/pony that is imported into New Zealand, i.e. whether it can still compete in the Novice section (5 wins or less), or if it has 6 or more wins, then it must compete in the Open Section. PONY SECTION CLASSES: All riders in Pony Section classes must be under 17 years of age as at 1st August, except Novice Ponies which may be ridden by an adult in Novice Classes ONLY FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES INFORMATION: The Rules of the Royal A & P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the person responsibilities risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage, or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule. by it's actions upon the central or periheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscskeletal, or urogenital systems. ARREARS: No person who is in arrears with regards to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted. Summary of RAS resolution process: The full process can be found on the RAS website. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is regards to an RAS official, the show may request assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner. YELLOW CARD SYSTEM: This Show supports the 'Yellow Card' system. A yellow card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules and Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rule Book, the RAS affiliated Show registered measuring stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on RAS website - www.ras.org.nz TEMPORARY PENS: Pens other than fixed permanent installments provided by the Show or approved by RAS is banned at all RAS shows and events and includes but not restricted to; tape, strings, ropes, & chains, RAS Rule GR7. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS Our Cattle yards are available for overnight stay for horses and ponies, or local farms have indicated they have some space in suitable fenced paddocks. Cattle pens are available on a 'first in' basis. Pens measure on average 2x5 metres. Water available at tap. Unloading at turn around area via Ward Road gate. Indicate on your entry form if you will be using a pen, and for which night. Extra lighting has been added.
