Every horse foaled before the first of August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date. For the purposes of this entire section the following definitions apply; DISTRICT EVENTS- confined to horses, galloways and ponies owned within the Balonne Shire or 100 km radius. MAIDEN- A horse which has never won a First Prize (excluding teams) at any Agricultural Show NOVICE - A horse which has never won a Championship at any P & A Show or a First Prize at a Royal Show (excluding team events) as at the beginning of this show. HACKS - The height for all galloways shall be over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands. Any horse measuring exactly 14 hands is a pony for this show. Any horse measuring over 15 hands is a hack for this show. PLEASURE HACK- must be ridden in a snaffle bit, no spurs or whip. Pony Hacks must be ridden by a rider under 17 years of age. A Galloway Hack cannot compete in other hack classes unless otherwise stated Stallions are not permitted in Hack classes. Juvenile Riders under 17 years of age cannot compete in Ring 1 Riding classes. Show Hunters - Horses are only permitted to compete in either the open hack, galloway, pony or the working hunter classes. Hunters may compete in led, maiden and novice classes in open rings. Bridles are to have plain browbanks and no coloured ribbons to be worn in hair. Junior riders 17 years and under are not permitted to wear top boots. All competitors ride at their own risk. No responsibility will be accepted for any damage or injury to any person or horse or any loss, damage or injury to anything whatsoever. All horses MUST be free from disease. A Show Society may carry out random tests for drugs in horses.
